## SECTION 1 1960 - 1969

1. In 1969 the Americans sent a rocket to the moon. Buzz Aldrin and Neil Armstrong were the first people to walk on the moon. Find out about the phases of the moon and maybe visit an observatory.
2. Pop music came on the scene in the 1960s with acts like The Beatles, The Rolling Stones, The Beach Boys and The Monkees. Listen to some 60s music and have a go at some of the dances (for example: the twist, the shake, the mashed potato and the locomotion).
3. Francis Chichester and Robin Knox-Johnston both sailed single-handed round the world in the 1960s. Make a paper boat and sail it.
4. Martin Luther King made his famous I HAVE A DREAM speech in 1963. What was it about and what dreams do you have for your future?
5. In 1966, England won the World Cup. Find out about a football team and make a poster to advertise it or practise some football skills.

## SECTION 2: 1970 - 1979

1. In 1977, the Queen celebrated her Silver Jubilee (25 years on the throne). Street parties were held all-round the Country. Hold your own Street Party or celebration.
  2. Virginia Wade won the Wimbledon Women's Singles Title. Wimbledon is one of the Grand Slam venues. What are the others? Find out about one of them.
  3. Items of clothing such as flares and midi skirts were popular in the 1970s. Find out about these and other popular items of clothing. Design your own outfit.
  4. Concorde made the first supersonic passenger flight in 1976. Where did it fly to? Make your own paper aeroplanes and see which flies the best.
  5. Princess Anne was the Sports Personality of the year in 1971. What are her sporting achievements? Make a model of a show jumping course.

## SECTION 3 1980 - 1989

1. Margaret Thatcher was Prime Minister for the whole of the 80s. She was the first female British Prime Minister and was born and brought up in Grantham, where her father owned two grocery shops. **What would you do if you were Prime Minister? Think of some ideas or create a Manifesto.**
  2. In 1980, an earthquake struck Mount St. Helens in USA, triggering the largest landslide in recorded history and a major volcanic eruption. (See You Tube video [here](#)). Use salt dough to create a volcano, then make it erupt.
  3. In 1982, Argentina invaded the Falkland Islands and Britain went to war. **Make a pom-pom or facecloth penguin from the Falklands and read one of the children's books by Simon Weston OR find out about Simon Weston** - voted person most deserving of a portrait in the National Portrait Gallery, by the public.
  4. In 1986, the Mir Space Station was launched. **Make and fire a rocket.** It could be a water rocket or use Alka Seltzer and water in a film canister.
  5. The 1980s was a decade of extreme, eclectic fashion - big hair, big shoulder pads, Spandex, leg warmers, power dressing, punk. **Use recyclable items to create your own 1980s fashion designs and hold a fashion show.**

## SECTION 4: 1990 - 1999

1. The first GOLD project took place in 1991. In 1992, a group from Minsk in Belarus arrived at Poacher to find out about the Guide movement in Britain. They invited a group from Lincolnshire South back to Minsk the following year and our county link with Minsk was born. **Try one of the Minsk activities on the Girlguiding Lincolnshire South website [here](#).**
  2. In 1992, Seagull House was built at Trusthorpe as a residential centre for Lincolnshire South County. **Design and make a model beach hut.** What would you put inside?
  3. In 1993 the song 'Hey Macarena' came out. **Learn to dance the Macarena.**
  4. The film Toy Story came out in 1996. **Hold a traditional board games evening in your unit.**
  5. In the 1990s, Brit Pop was beyond cool. The Spice Girls brought 'Girl Power' to the fore. **Recreate the iconic Union Jack dress worn by 'Ginger Spice' Geri Halliwell in 1993 and find out what each part of the Union flag stands for.**

## SECTION 5 2000 - 2009

1. The first ever Big Gig was held at Wembley Arena in 2000. **Research songs from 2000 - 2009 and do a performance for your unit like a mini-Big Gig.** (e.g. - Britney Spears: Oops I did it again, Kylie Minogue: Can't get you out of my head.)
2. In 2004 the '4ward, 4 self, 4 others' peer education programme was launched. Girls take part in sessions run by their peers on subjects including media awareness, eating disorders, the environment and sexual health. **Invite a Peer Educator to your unit to do a session.**
3. The 2000s saw the start of a new millennium and there were many changes happening in Girlguiding with the new name, a new President and new clothing for Brownies. **Make your own Thames Millennium Bridge.**
4. In the 2000s Girlguiding Lincolnshire South developed 2 challenge badges: the International Challenge for Brownies and the Environment Challenge. **What can you do to help the environment? Take some photographs of how you have made an impact.**
5. Kim's Game has been part of the Guide programme for many years. **Give it a modern twist by using souvenirs which have been collected from holidays abroad.**

## SECTION 6: 2010 - 2019

1. The youth of the 2010s were called the best-behaved generation on record but they showed their displeasure at the lack of climate change measures by governments in a series of worldwide school strikes. **Hold an evening/afternoon to raise money for a charity in aid those who have been hit by an earthquake, floods or typhoon.**
  2. London hosted the Olympic Games in 2012 and the Queen celebrated her Diamond Jubilee, going on to become the longest reigning monarch ever. **Hold your own mini-Olympic games and make an Olympic torch.**
  3. There has been a rapid change in technology and the original iPad was released 27<sup>th</sup> January 2010. **Make your own iPad; what do you think it would look like in 10/20years time?**
  4. Alice in Wonderland remake was released 3 March 2010. **Have a Mad Hatter's tea party one evening.**
  5. The 2010s marked the centenary of Guides and the opening of the fifth World Centre, Kusafiri, which moves around Africa. **Try foods from each of the WAGGS areas.**
